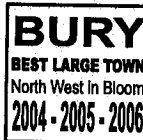

**PROPOSED TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER
HEYWOOD ROAD/HEATON STREET, PRESTWICH**

STATEMENT OF JUSTIFICATION

There have been a number of accidents on Heywood Road near to its junction with Heaton Street.

From records it would appear that there have been three accidents in the last three years resulting in three casualties with slight injuries. Although, the accidents in question were not caused by junction users, it is suggested that the introduction of parking restrictions would alleviate obstruction and visibility problems and improve the situation for traffic turning into and out of Heaton Street from Heywood Road.

The proposed "No waiting at any time" parking restrictions are highlighted on the attached plan.

The above was discussed by the Traffic Management Unit at its meeting on 27 September 2007, the decision being to recommend the introduction of no waiting at any time restrictions in order to alleviate obstruction and visibility problems.

The following proposals have been approved for advertising under delegated powers:

No Waiting at any Time

Heywood Road, Prestwich

East side from a point 15 metres north of the northerly kerblineline of Heaton Street to a point 15 metres south of the southerly kerblineline of Heaton Street.

Revocation of No Waiting at any Time

Heaton Street, Prestwich

Both sides from the easterly kerblineline of Heywood Road for a distance of 10 metres in an easterly direction.
